- Parking** We have a parking arrangement with the garage at 51 West 56th Street (second garage on the left between 5th and 6th Avenues). You can park Monday - Friday from 5:00 - 12:00 pm for \$9 and Saturday, Sunday and Holidays any 12 hours (maximum) to 1:00 am for \$9. There is an additional surcharge for oversized vehicles. Please get parking discount coupons at the security desk to take advantage of this reduced rate. When you pick up your car, please show the parking attendant the coupon before he/she processes the ticket stub, or you will be charged the regular rate.
- Large-Print Hymnals** Large-print hymnals, with text but no music notation, are available. Please ask one of the ushers.
- Hearing Enhancement** Hearing enhancement equipment is available to help you hear the service more clearly. An usher will be happy to assist you. At the close of worship, please return the unit at the rear of the sanctuary.

DEVELOPMENT

- Commitment 2010 Update** We have received \$2,128,201 in pledges for 2010 from 650 families to date. We will need \$171,799 more in pledges to meet our \$2.3 million goal. To help us meet our goal, please either mail your pledge card to the church office or fill out an online pledge card at www.fapc.org.

The thermometer that is posted in several places throughout the building represents an effort by the Board of Trustees to address our \$150,000 anticipated budget deficit for 2010. If this goal is attained there will be no need to further reduce our 2010 budget. These additional or new pledges are added to our overall 2010 pledge commitments as reported above. If we reach beyond the \$150,000 Trustee challenge we could enhance our programming and increase the building hours that have been drastically curtailed. Thank you so very much for your generous support thus far to this endeavor.
