





WORSHIP NOTES

The Anthem is by the contemporary Scottish composer James MacMillan. A New Song was composed in 1997, and contains many of MacMillan's hallmark sonorities: vocal ornamentation influenced by traditional Scottish music; modal melodies; contrapuntal sections; and a creative, unusual form. The atmospheric organ accompaniment is especially fascinating: throughout the majority of the piece, the organ whispers and flutters around the choir like a spirit, but then rises to prominence, bringing the piece to a dramatic and powerful close.
