SCRIPTURE LESSON

Genesis 18:20-33

Then the Lord said, "How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin! I must go down and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me; and if not, I will know." So the men turned from there, and went toward Sodom, while Abraham remained standing before the Lord.

Then Abraham came near and said, "Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?" Rabbi Davidson has served Congregation Emanu-El for five years, after more than a decade as senior rabbi of Temple Beth El of Northern Westchester in Chappaqua, and five years as associate rabbi of Central Synagogue in Manhattan. A graduate of Princeton University and ordained by the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, Rabbi Davidson has done notable work in anti-death penalty advocacy, LGBT inclusion and interfaith dialogue. He has received honors for his interfaith efforts from the Westchester Jewish Council and the American Jewish Committee.

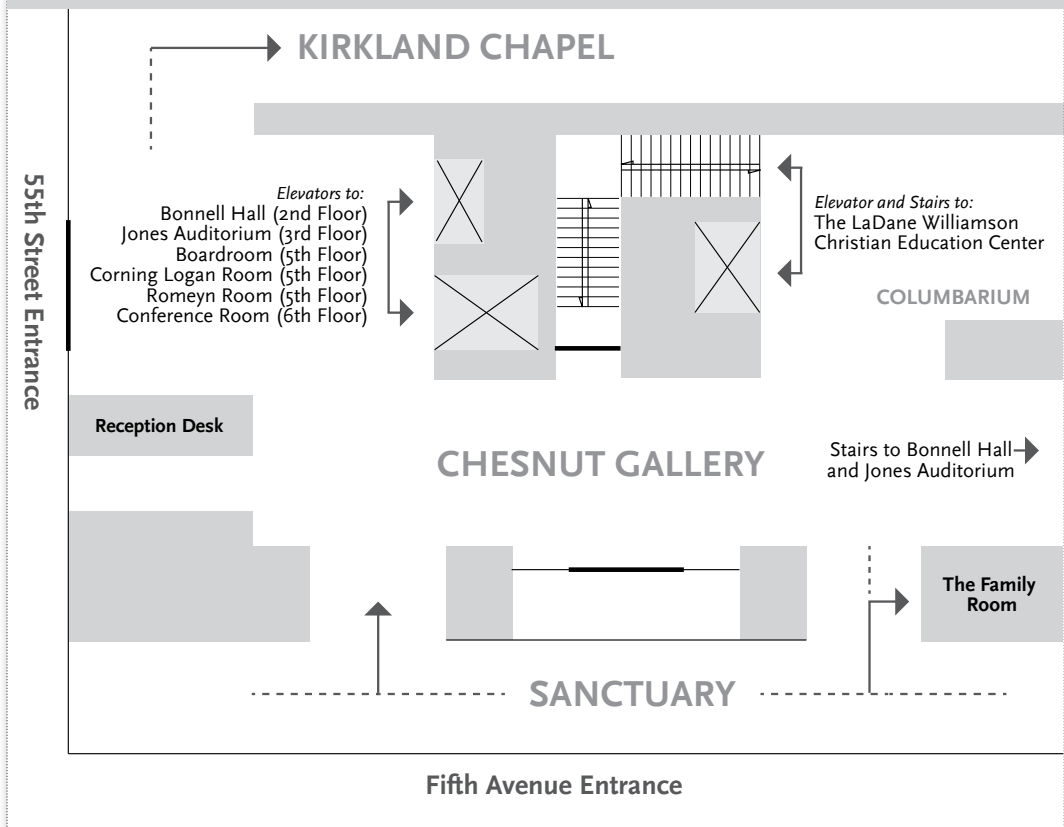
