

#### If You Are New Here

You will find children's Bibles and children's worship bulletins in the pews, as well as easy access to our Family Room, located just outside the Sanctuary. (See the map on the back of the bulletin for the exact location.) If you are attending worship in Kirkland Chapel, the ushers can provide a worship bag to keep your child engaged. (You may return these materials at the end of the service.) We also provide childcare for infants and toddlers from 9 am until 12:30 pm in the LaDane Williamson Christian Education Center. #### SCRIPTURE LESSON

#### Colossians 2:6-19

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. Do not let anyone disqualify you, insisting on self-abasement and worship of angels, dwelling on visions, puffed up without cause by a human way of thinking, and not holding fast to the head, from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows with a growth that is from God.

#### WORSHIP NOTES

J.S. Bach's Mass in B minor is a monumental work—a complete setting of the Mass Ordinary—that involved a nearly 20-year gestation period. Begun in 1733 and completed in 1749 (one year before the composer's death), the Mass did not have its first, complete performance for nearly 80 years, in 1828. Scholars view the Mass in B minor as not only one of Bach's finest works, but among the finest contributions to the musical canon.

Charles Gounod composed more than 100 songs in his lifetime. This morning's Offertory is Gounod's adaptation of Bach's famous Prelude in C major. Taking Bach's accompaniment, Gounod adds his own vocal melody above the piano, using the Lord's Prayer as the text.


