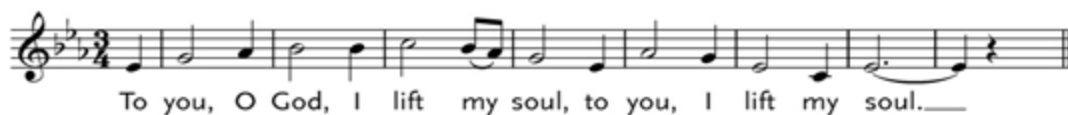

## WORSHIP NOTES

---

The first solo this morning comes from Leonard Bernstein's *MASS: A Theatre Piece for Singers, Players, and Dancers*. *Mass* was commissioned by Jacqueline Kennedy to be part of the opening ceremonies for the new John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC. The piece was premiered on Sept. 8, 1971. Although Bernstein initially considered writing a more traditional setting of the Mass, he eventually decided on a staged theater piece employing huge musical forces: a celebrant, three choirs, altar servers, a full symphony orchestra, an on-stage rock band, and a marching band! Much of the text for *Mass* is from the Latin Tridentine Mass of the Roman Catholic Church, but Bernstein also employed English lyrics written in collaboration with the celebrated Broadway composer Stephen Schwartz and singer-songwriter Paul Simon. "A Simple Song" appears early in *Mass* as the opening hymn following the *Kyrie eleison*.

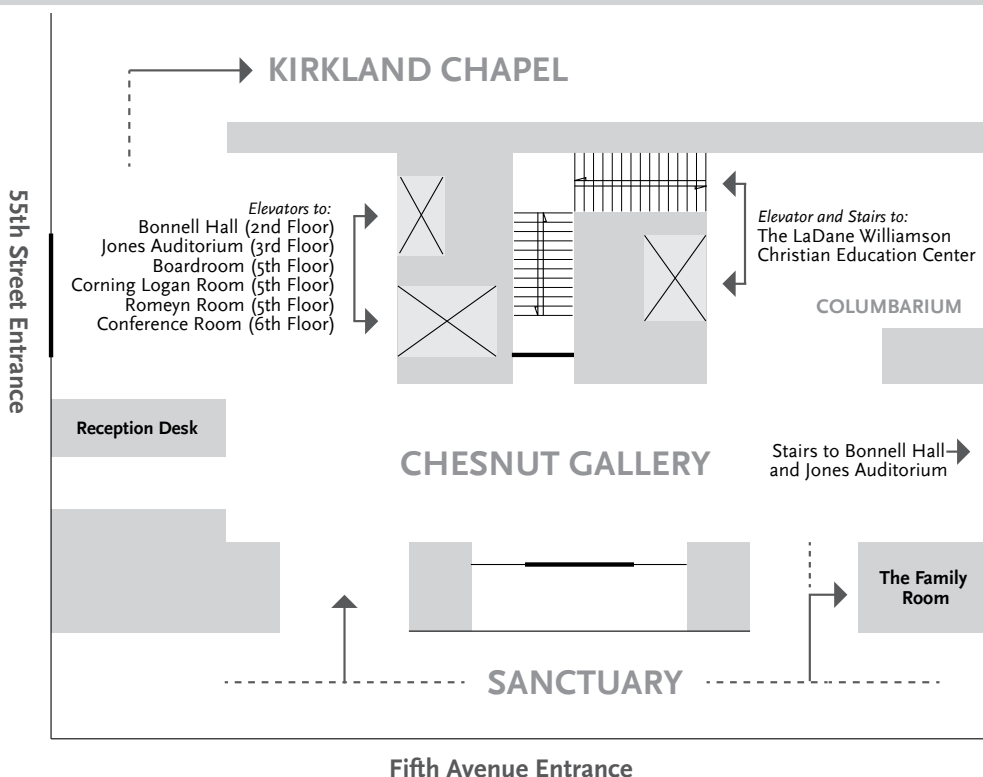
