





Worship Notes

Born in 1925, Alice Parker is an American composer, arranger, conductor, and teacher. She has authored five operas, eleven song-cycles, thirty-three cantatas, eleven works for chorus and orchestra, forty-seven choral suites, and more than forty hymns—all original compositions. Parker is particularly renowned for the large number of choral arrangements she has composed based on pre-existing folk-songs and hymns, many of which were produced in collaboration with the legendary American choral conductor, Robert Shaw. Parker has drawn on many sources of inspiration for these arrangements, including spirituals, mountain hymns, and folk songs, early-American hymns, and international folk-songs, most notably in French, Spanish, Hebrew, and Ladino. This morning's Anthem, *The Hebrew Children*, is a fine example of her distinctive compositional voice.

The Offertory Anthem, *Didn't My Lord Deliver Daniel*?, is one of the most famous arrangements by the great Moses Hogan, one of America's foremost composers and arrangers of choral music. Hogan's inimitable spiritual settings are sung and beloved throughout the world, and are widely admired for their masterful and stylish use of the choral instrument. Although Hogan was only 45 when he passed away from a brain tumor in 2003, his legacy lives on through his many compositions and arrangements as one of the most creative and influential figures in 20th-century American choral music.
