Music

The choral pieces this morning are two of five movements from Srul Irving Glick's dramatic song cycle for choir and orchestra entitled *Triumph of the Spirit*. Glick, a Jewish Canadian composer, wrote the cycle in 1996 after recovering from a gunshot wound he received while leaving a choir rehearsal at Beth Tikvah Synagogue in Toronto, where he served as cantor. About this traumatic experience Glick wrote, "The sheer perverseness and unexpectedness of this event forced me to reexamine my deepest feelings about life and my place in it. It was then, I realized, and with great impact, that everybody in some way or another struggles against the hardships and adversities in life, and that each personal and spiritual success becomes a 'triumph of the spirit'. This, therefore, became the title and philosophy behind the creation of my new choral work, and continues to be the thrust of my personal and artistic quests in life." *Avinu Malkeinu* and *Adonai*, *Adonai* are two of the great traditional hymns of the Jewish faith.

Carmelle Beaugelin, *New World Coming: The Resurrection of Courage*, 2021. Used with permission. This final installment in her seven-work Lenten Series, *Nina's Liturgy In 7 Last Words* (Spring 2021), draws inspiration from Haitian folk art depictions of spirit (pneuma) and brings into dialogue Christ' resurrection alongside the role that courage plays in challenging normative conditions of legalized oppression.
