

WORSHIP NOTES

Barrie Cabena, the composer of this morning's Anthem, is a prolific Australian-Canadian composer with nearly 500 compositions to his credit. He has also written a considerable amount of poetry, some of which is included in his compositions. Dr. Cabena was born in Melbourne, Australia in 1933, and pursued his music education in England at the Royal College of Music with Herbert Howells, among other luminaries of English music. In the mid-1960s, Dr. Cabena immigrated to Canada where he has lived and worked as a composer, performer, and teacher ever since. In *Prayer of St. Francis*, Dr. Cabena uses dramatic musical contrasts to illustrate the various pairs of opposites in the prayer (such as hatred vs. love).

Sir William McKie was also born in Melbourne, Australia (in 1901) and, like Cabena, pursued higher musical education at the Royal College of Music in London. After returning to Australia to serve as director of music at Clifton College in Bristol and as City Organist in Melbourne, McKie made his way back to England in 1938 to become director of music at Magdalen College, Oxford. In 1941, he became organist and Master of the Music at Westminster Abbey where he remained until 1963. During these years, McKie had the great distinction of directing the music for both the royal wedding in 1947 and the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953. This morning's Offertory Anthem, *We wait for thy loving-kindness*, O God, was written in 1947 for the marriage of Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip. The original instructions for the marriage ceremony were that it was to be a simple service and not a state occasion, and the King stipulated the service should not last more than fifty-five minutes. McKie's response is a concise piece that nevertheless contains a great deal of power and beauty within its relatively brief dramatic arc.


