Worship Notes

Today's Response to Confession was composed on Ash Wednesday in response to the ongoing war in Ukraine by the Canadian composer, Jeff Enns. According to Enns, his grandparents were Ukranian refugees who fled to Canada nearly 100 years ago to escape Russian oppression. "How can you respond to that?" he writes. "I write music, and this is a prayer for the entire world, but specifically for the people of Ukraine."

Stephen Paulus's *The Three Hermits* is based on Leo Tolstoy's short story of the same name, an exploration of the nature of prayer. In the story, a bishop travels to a remote island because he has heard that three holy hermits live there, and he feels called to save their souls by teaching them how to pray properly. After spending a difficult day trying to teach them the Lord's Prayer, he returns to his boat which is anchored some distance from the island. As they're practicing the words the bishop has just taught them, the hermits realize they have forgotten part of the prayer. They run out on top of the water to the bishop's boat as though on dry land, and ask him to teach them again. The astonished bishop replies that God is obviously pleased with the way they pray already, and bids them go back to continue as they were. "The Pilgrims' Hymn" is sung by a chorus of Pilgrims accompanying the bishop on his voyage. This piece was sung at the funerals of Presidents Reagan and Ford.


