WORSHIP NOTES

In honor of World Communion Sunday, this morning's music selections draw on sacred music traditions from around the world. The *Kyrie* comes from Africa by the composer Dinah Reindorf of Ghana, and the *Gloria* is by the Argentinian composer Pablo Sosa.

The Anthem is by Ernani Aguiar, perhaps one of the best-known contemporary Brazilian composers. With its rapid articulations and gripping rhythms, Aguiar's setting of Psalm 150 is characteristic of his style and an exciting example of contemporary Latin American choral music. The Offertory Anthem, For the Beauty of the Earth, is among the most famous pieces by the British composer John Rutter, one of the most popular contemporary composers of sacred choral music.

Paul Halley is a Canadian church musician of international renown, perhaps most famous for his tenure at the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine here in New York, where he served as music director from 1977 until 1989. Halley is a major champion of world music, and his compositions and arrangements are notable for their musical creativity and accessibility. The *Freedom Trilogy* is an inspiring and exciting arrangement that has become an international festival favorite. Combining the 16th-century *Kyrie de Angelis* from Europe, the South African *Haleluya Pelo Tsa Rona/Siyahamba* and the beloved *Amazing Grace* (whose author, John Newton, also wrote this morning's choral benediction), Halley's vision of a world without boundaries is powerfully conveyed in this musical celebration.

Volunteering

Volunteering is one of the most important ways we show that God's house is truly a place where all are welcome. Each week, members of this community serve as ushers and greeters, prepare and deliver meals to the homebound, provide comfort and support to the elderly, lead tours for members and visitors, and work with the underserved of New York City.
