



WORSHIP NOTES

Music

Known as the Dean of Black Women Composers, Undine Smith Moore studied composition at Fisk University and the Juilliard School, where she graduated *cum laude* in 1926. While her compositions include works for piano and other ensembles, Moore is more widely known for her choral works. *Scenes from the Life of a Martyr*, a 16-part oratorio on the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was premiered at Carnegie Hall and nominated for a Pulitzer Prize. Her setting of *I Believe This Is Jesus*, the Introit this morning, is a wonderful example of her distinctive style.

The Offertory Anthem, What Does the Lord Require of You?, was written in 2005 by Mark Miller. Miller is assistant professor of church music at Drew Theological School and a lecturer in the practice of sacred music at Yale University. He is also the minister of music of Christ Church in Summit, New Jersey. Miller's memorable setting of this famous reading from Micah playfully combines two primary musical inspirations: the African American Gospel tradition and the Baroque contrapuntal style of J.S. Bach.

Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church is delighted to welcome the Rev. Dr. Keri Day as we honor the legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. Day is an associate professor of constructive theology and African American religion at Princeton Theological Seminary, where her teaching and research interests include womanist/feminist theologies, social critical theory, cultural studies, economics and Afro-Pentecostalism. ABC News recognized Dr. Day as one of six black women at the center of gravity in theological education in America. We are pleased to welcome her to our pulpit for the first time.

In the Gallery: John Howard Sanden

John Howard Sanden, a world-renowned portrait artist and longtime member of this church, died on Christmas Eve at age 87. Sanden painted the portraits of the Rev. Dr. Bryant M. Kirkland and the Rev.
