



SCRIPTURE LESSON

Luke 6:1-11

One sabbath while Jesus was going through the grainfields, his disciples plucked some heads of grain, rubbed them in their hands, and ate them. But some of the Pharisees said, "Why are you doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" Jesus answered, "Have you not read what David did when he and his companions were hungry? He entered the house of God and took and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and gave some to his companions?" Then he said to them, "The Son of Man is lord of the sabbath." On another sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught, and there was a man there whose right hand was withered. The scribes and the Pharisees watched him to see whether he would cure on the sabbath, so that they might find an accusation against him. Even though he knew what they were thinking, he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come and stand here." He got up and stood there. Then Jesus said to them, "I ask you, is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to destroy it?" After looking around at all of them, he said to him, "Stretch out your hand." He did so, and his hand was restored. WORSHIP NOTES

The first Anthem was composed by the gifted American organist and composer Larry King (1932–1990). Probably not the Larry King that first comes to mind, this Larry King served as organist and director of music at Trinity Church, Wall Street, for 21 years before his death from melanoma at age 58. King composed *Let Us Love in Deed and Truth* for the church's volunteer family choir, which he directed. The warmth and tenderness of King's setting is a beautiful musical illustration of the profound simplicity of our faith's essential teaching as captured in the text from 1 John.

Paul Halley is a Canadian church musician of international renown, perhaps most famous for his tenure at the Cathedral of Saint John the Divine here in New York City, where he served as music director from 1977 until 1989. A champion of world music, Halley's compositions and arrangements are notable for their musical creativity and accessibility. His unique setting of the famous hymn, *Jesu, The Very Thought of Thee*, is notable for its colorful organ accompaniment—cascading sixteenth notes give the setting an airy, weightless quality from the opening measures, and jazzy modulations throughout breathe fresh life into this old classic.
