


We provide mask-required and mask-optional seating areas in the Sanctuary. Please ask an usher if you have questions.

Worship Notes

This morning's choral music was written by the Canadian composer and pianist Ruth Watson Henderson. Over the past five decades, Watson Henderson has been a pioneering female force in the world of classical composition which, especially in her earlier years, has been a field largely populated by men. Her music is admired throughout the world for its distinctive blend of musical sophistication and accessibility, which unites beautiful and memorable melodies with her characteristically impressionistic sense of harmony. Although she has written for various instruments and ensembles over the course of her career, Watson Henderson is especially celebrated for her remarkable choral music. Her love for the choral instrument and the mastery of her compositional craft were honed during her years as collaborative pianist for the internationally renowned professional choir the Elmer Iseler Singers. Over the coming year, the Fifth Avenue Choir will present many of Watson Henderson's most significant choral pieces in worship in preparation for a major concert and recording project of her works early in 2024.
