

WORSHIP NOTES

The choral music this morning is drawn from Duruflé's sublime setting of the Requiem mass, the mass traditionally sung to commemorate the dead. Composed in 1947 and dedicated to the memory of the composer's father, the work is a true masterpiece and one of the great highlights of the choral repertoire. The vast majority of the work is based on Gregorian chant. Duruflé masterfully sets these ancient melodies (among the very oldest in Western Music) in a swirl of Impressionistic harmonies and varying accompanimental textures, at once honoring the simple beauty of the original material while imbuing it with a profoundly personal expressivity.
