



#### WORSHIP NOTES

Both of the choral pieces this morning were written by Mark Miller. Miller currently serves as Assistant Professor of Church Music at Drew Theological School and is a Lecturer in the Practice of Sacred Music at Yale University. He is also the Minister of Music of Christ Church in Summit, New Jersey.

The first Anthem, *Draw the Circle Wide*, was written in 2008. According to Miller, "This piece is really at the heart of what I feel music ministry should be about, what the church should be about: telling more and more people about God's love, and that the circle of God's love is wide enough to embrace everyone."

The Offertory Anthem, What Does the Lord Require of You?, was written in 2005. Miller's memorable setting of this famous reading from Micah playfully combines two primary musical inspirations to tremendous effect: the African American Gospel tradition and the Baroque contrapuntal style of J.S. Bach.
