PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

1 Samuel 13:5-14 SCRIPTURE LESSON

The Philistines mustered to fight with Israel, thirty thousand chariots, and six thousand horsemen, and troops like the sand on the seashore in multitude; they came up and encamped at Michmash, to the east of Beth-aven. When the Israelites saw that they were in distress (for the troops were hard pressed), the people hid themselves in caves and in holes and in rocks and in tombs and in cisterns. Some Hebrews crossed the Jordan to the land of Gad and Gilead. Saul was still at Gilgal, and all the people followed him trembling.

He waited seven days, the time appointed by Samuel; but Samuel did not come to Gilgal, and the people began to slip away from Saul. So Saul said, "Bring the burnt offering here to me,

and the offerings of well-being." And he offered the burnt offering. As soon as he had finished offering the burnt offering, Samuel arrived; and Saul went out to meet him and salute him. Samuel said, "What have you done?" Saul replied, "When I saw that the people were slipping away from me, and that you did not come within the days appointed, and that the Philistines were mustering at Michmash, I said, 'Now the Philistines will come down upon me at Gilgal, and I have not entreated the favor of the Lord'; so I forced myself, and offered the burnt offering." Samuel said to Saul, "You have done foolishly; you have not kept the commandment of the Lord your God, which he commanded you. The Lord would have established your kingdom over Israel forever, but now your kingdom will not continue; the Lord has sought out a man after his own heart; and the Lord has appointed him to be ruler over his people, because you have not kept what the Lord commanded you."



WORSHIP NOTES

In celebration of World Communion Sunday, this morning's music selections highlight sacred traditions from around the globe.

The *Kyrie* is composed by Dinah Reindorf of Ghana, drawing on African musical traditions, while the *Gloria* is by Argentine composer Pablo Sosa, representing the rich musical heritage of Latin America.

Our anthem, *Salmo 150* by Ernani Aguiar, exemplifies the vibrant rhythms and dynamic articulation that define contemporary Brazilian choral music. Aguiar is one of Brazil's most celebrated living composers, and this energetic setting of Psalm 150 showcases his characteristic rhythmic drive and exhilarating style.

The Offertory Anthem, *Wana Baraka*, is a choral arrangement of a beloved Kenyan religious song. Arranged by Shawn Kirchner, this piece layers complex rhythms and harmonies, building toward a joyful, radiant conclusion in D major. Kirchner was introduced to the song by a Kenyan delegation at the 1994 Agricultural Missions International Consultation in Sogakope, Ghana, and his arrangement captures the spirit and vitality of this African tradition.

Paul Halley, a renowned Canadian church musician and former music director of the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City, has long been a champion of world music. His *Freedom Trilogy*, sung during communion, is an inspiring medley that combines the 16th-century European *Kyrie de Angelis*, the South African *Haleluya Pelo Tsa Rona/Siyahamba*, and the classic *Amazing Grace*. Halley's arrangement reflects his vision of unity across cultures, creating a powerful celebration of a world without boundaries.


