

TODAY: CREDO: Mothers of the Messiah | Ruth

This year, our clergy will explore the matrilineal ancestry of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew. Together, we'll examine Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, and Bathsheba—why they are named in Jesus's genealogy and what their stories reveal. These remarkable women, from diverse backgrounds and challenges, showed extraordinary strength, resilience, and courage. Through this series, we'll reflect on how their lives deepen our understanding of faith, redemption, and God's grace. For virtual participants, each CREDO lecturer will join our Crossroads Podcast to share insights into the Mothers of the Messiah. Werner Ramirez will lead us in exploring the story of Ruth, a devoted Moabite who left everything behind to stand by her mother-in-law, Naomi, in a foreign land. Through her loyalty and kindness, Ruth found a new community and became part of the lineage of Jesus. How does Ruth's story invite us to see faith, family, and God's providence in fresh ways?

Sunday, May 18, 11 am: Cantata Sunday

Join us for our second annual Cantata Sunday as the Fifth Avenue Choir presents *To the Hands* by Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Caroline Shaw—a haunting and deeply moving cantata offered in place of a traditional sermon. Written for choir and string quintet in 2016, this powerful work is a meditation on the global refugee crisis, giving voice to the suffering and resilience of displaced peoples across the world. At its center is the movement "Her beacon-hand beckons," a poignant setting of lines from Emma Lazarus's *The New Colossus*—the poem that welcomes the "huddled masses yearning to breathe free" at the base of the Statue of Liberty. Come experience this timely and evocative work of sacred music that invites reflection, stirs compassion, and speaks urgently to our time.
