As the Prelude begins, we invite you into a period of quiet reflection as we prepare for worship. Please silence all electronic devices and do not take flash photos during the service.



Today: Welcome the Rev. Dr. Jess Winderweedle

Today we are proud to welcome the Rev. Dr. Jess Winderweedle (she/her) as our guest preacher. Rev. Dr. Winderweedle is an ordained minister in the United Methodist Church and a recent graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary, where she earned a PhD in Practical Theology (Homiletics). Her doctoral research centers on the experiences of openly LGBTQIA+ preachers from Mainline Protestant traditions and explores the possibilities of a queer-informed approach to the formation and instruction of preachers of all identities. Jess also serves as the program coordinator for the Expanding the Pulpit program, a Lilly-funded initiative of the Presbytery of Philadelphia. This fall, she will begin a new role teaching preaching at Drew Theological School in Madison, NJ, as a Louisville Institute postdoctoral fellow. Jess grew up in Oklahoma, but she has called the East Coast home now for over 18 years. Before returning to school, Jess served (alongside one of her favorite co-conspirators, Rev. Werner!) at Kingston United Methodist Church, where she also founded The Feed Truck, a mobile campus and community outreach ministry.
