## WORSHIP NOTES

Herbert Howells's Office of Holy Communion (*Collegium Regale*) was composed in 1945 for the choir of King's College, Cambridge, deepening a partnership that also produced his celebrated settings of the morning and evening canticles. The *Gloria, Sanctus,* and *Agnus Dei* from this Communion service display the qualities that make Howells's music so distinctive: radiant, modal-inflected harmonies; long-breathed, lyrical vocal lines; and a remarkable ability to suggest both grandeur and intimacy at once. Written for the reverberant acoustics of King's College Chapel, this music captures a vision of worship that is expansive, mystical, and deeply moving.

Also heard this morning is "Master Tallis's Testament," one of Howells's most beloved organ works. It belongs to his Six Pieces for Organ, composed in the late 1930s, and takes as its point of inspiration a theme by the great Tudor composer Thomas Tallis. The work unfolds as a meditative reverie, carrying the listener on a journey through the organ's full palette of sounds: from the gentlest strings, flutes, and solo reeds, through ever-growing sonorities and to the majestic power of the full instrument, before subsiding once more into quiet. In its union of reverence for the past and lush 20th-century harmony, it is quintessential Howells.


