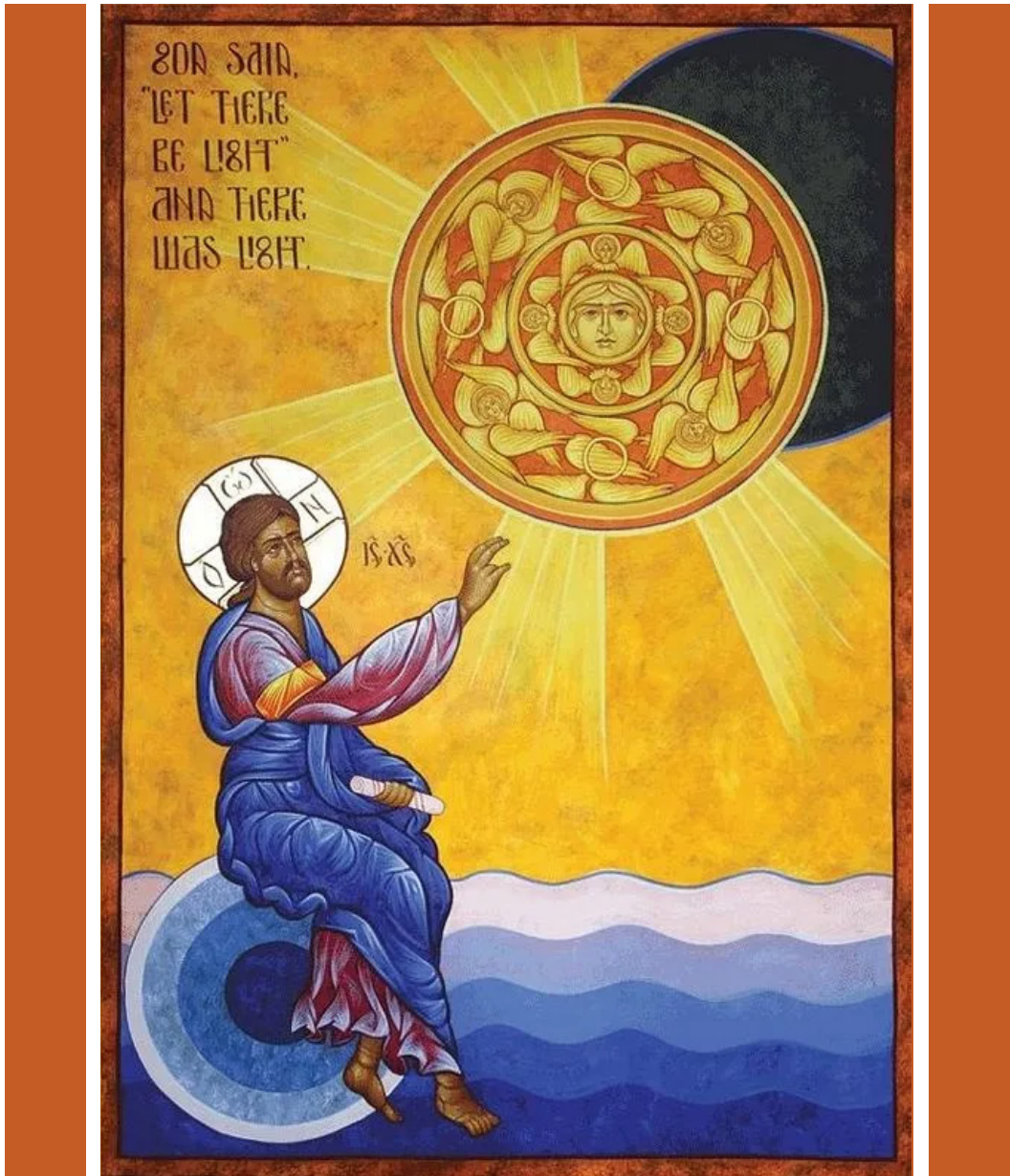



## WORSHIP NOTES

---

This evening's choral music explores two complementary expressions of contemplation at the close of day. In Morten Lauridsen's *Sure on this Shining Night*, James Agee's text gazes outward into the vastness of creation with awe and wonder, arriving at a profound sense of peace through the recognition of one's place within a greater, divinely ordered whole. Lauridsen's luminous setting for choir and piano seems to suspend time, allowing the poem's quiet wonder to unfold with extraordinary warmth and clarity.

H. Balfour Gardiner's beloved *Evening Hymn* turns from reflection toward prayer. Setting the ancient Compline hymn *Te lucis ante terminum*, the work surrounds the listener in a rich and deeply expressive tapestry of sound, propelled by an organ part that rises and recedes with both warmth and power. As the prayer unfolds, Gardiner's music gives voice not only to serenity and repose, but also to the earnest human longing for protection, peace, and light in the gathering darkness.

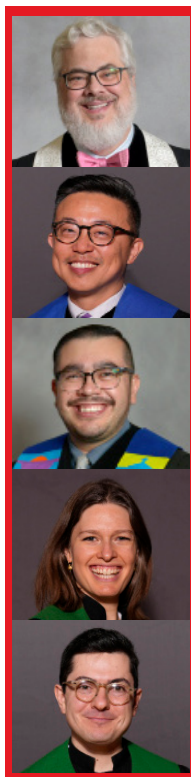
