

This spring we invite you to join us for our annual series on foundations of Christian theology, CREDO, led by our very own clergy. The Presbyterian Church (USA) has eleven confessions in The Book of Confessions. While most of these confessions date back several hundred years, four of them were written as recently as the twentieth century. What do churches in Nazi Germany, apartheid South Africa, and the political climate of the United States in 1967 have to say to us today? What themes brought together two of the largest Presbyterian churches in the United States in 1983? We hope you'll join us in Bonnell Hall at 12:30 pm this Sunday for the final CREDO of the year. This week, the Rev. Dr. Scott Black Johnston speaks on the Theological Declaration of Barmen, adopted by Christians in Nazi Germany who stood against that fascist and wicked regime's attempt to corrupt religion for political and malevolent ends.


